IGNITE Results & Review

IGNITE Rural Business Competition Grand Finale: A Night of Triumph and Celebration

Great Bend, Kansas - October 9, 2023 - The stage was set, the anticipation was palpable, and the excitement was electric as the IGNITE Rural Business Competition Grand Finale unfolded on October 5th at the iconic Crest Theater in downtown Great Bend, Kansas. This thrilling event marked the culmination of an exhilarating journey that began with the top 10 businesses competing in a semi-final round.

With 1805 total viewers tuning in to the live stream on Thursday night, igniteks.com saw an impressive 887 visitors directly to the site and an additional 1650 coming from Facebook to the site. In the last 30 days alone, there were a total of 2,565 site sessions, showcasing the widespread interest and engagement generated by the competition.



One of the highlights of the evening was the People's Choice award, which was presented to 10-39 Café. They not only earned the admiration of the audience but also an additional \$5,000, thanks to their remarkable 56% share of the votes. A total of 921 votes were cast on the Slido.com platform between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8:50 p.m.

The judges for the evening, Kari Smith, Jason Mayers, and Jerrod Westfahl, played the role of "sharks" or judges, carefully evaluating the top 5 finalists. Each finalist delivered a compelling 10-minute pitch followed by an

- 2nd Place: 10-39 Café - winning \$30,000

• 3rd Place: Hatchet Axtion - winning \$10,000

These businesses demonstrated outstanding innovation, dedication, and a vision for contributing to the Barton County community. The competition showcased the remarkable entrepreneurial spirit thriving in the region.

Hosted by Shannon Towns and Lyle Jones, the evening was filled with humor, sponsor acknowledgments, and an opportunity for the audience to get to know the contestants. The event was a true celebration of innovation and entrepreneurship in Barton County.

Great Bend Economic Development launches BC ReNEW, a New Housing Rehab Program for Barton County Homeowners

Great Bend Economic Development launches BC ReNEW, a New Housing Rehab Program for Barton County Homeowners

Great Bend Economic Development (GBED) is excited to announce the launch of its BC ReNew - Housing Rehab Program in Great Bend, Ellinwood, Hoisington, and Claflin. This program aims to provide homeowners in these areas with an opportunity to upgrade their older homes while receiving a rebate grant of up to 10% for material purchases.

Under the program, eligible homeowners who occupy their properties within the city limits may qualify for a rebate grant based on the cost of their rehabilitation project. The rebate is determined as follows:

- 8.7% of material purchases if less than 90% of the materials are locally purchased, provided the material costs exceed \$10,000 per approved project.
- 10.0% of material purchases if over 90% of the materials are locally purchased, provided the material costs exceed \$10,000 per approved project.

The maximum award per recipient is set at \$10,000. Homeowners and contractors must demonstrate their experience in property rehabilitation or present a plan that utilizes contracted resources to carry out the rehabilitation process.

The application process involves homeowners submitting a complete application with all the required documents to the GBED office for review by the Housing Rehab Committee. The committee will then approve or reject the application and inform the homeowner accordingly. Documentation, including before and after photos, will be required for verification purposes.

BC RENEW

HOUSING REHAB PROGRAM

Housing Rehab Committee, in conjunction with the GBED Board, will review all program applications and make recommendations for approval. Ongoing rehab projects will also be monitored by the committee to provide guidance and support to owners and contractors. For the year 2023, a total of \$35,000 has been allocated to this program.

Eligible upgrades under the BC ReNEW Housing Rehab Program include structural improvements, energy conservation measures, and modernization projects.

BC ReNEW is committed to revitalizing the community and enhancing the quality of housing in Great Bend, Ellinwood, Hoisington, and Claflin. This program presents a unique opportunity for

homeowners to improve their homes while receiving financial assistance.


